SOWK 3384 Children and the Law 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 3385 Social Work with Children 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 3400 Mental Health Services 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 4293 Social Work in Health Care 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 4423 School Social Work Practice 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 4424 School Social Work Services 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 4450 HIV/AIDS: Global Impact 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course will assist students in comprehending and comparing economics from a global view as it relates and affect the U.S. in general.

SOWK 4494 Social Work & Chemical Dependency 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.

SOWK 4495 Human Sexuality 3(3-0)

The rationale for this proposal is that this course is designed to provide three (3) credit hours to students as an elective.
