About the Speaker

The Honorable Shirley Franklin

The Honorable Shirley Franklin was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. She earned the Bachelor of Arts (BA) Degree in Sociology from Howard University in 1968, and the Masters Degree (MA) in Sociology from the University of Pennsylvania.

She was elected to serve as the 58th Mayor of the City of Atlanta in 2001. She was inaugurated in 2002 and served two terms until 2009. The mayor is term limited in Atlanta. She became the first female mayor of Atlanta and the first African American woman to serve as mayor of a major southern city. Immediately upon taking office, Mayor Franklin began work to build a "Best in Class" managed city by strengthening existing frameworks, implementing progressive changes and making the tough decisions necessary to improve Atlanta. She returned accountability to city government and improved the quality of life for all Atlantans.

A few of Mayor Franklin's accomplishments while serving as the Mayor of Atlanta include implementing one of the strongest ethics reform programs in the nation and an Ethics Task Force; completing the \$6.3 billion Fifth Runway of the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport; establishing a commission of city leaders to study the problem of homelessness in the city and creating the "Blueprint to End Homelessness in Atlanta in 10 years." The flagship project, the 24/7 Gateway Center, designed to serve 500 people a day with needed personal and health services, opened in July 2005; and implementing the New Century Economic Development Plan outlining an economic vision through 2009 that includes Brand Atlanta, the Beltline, and transportation improvements.

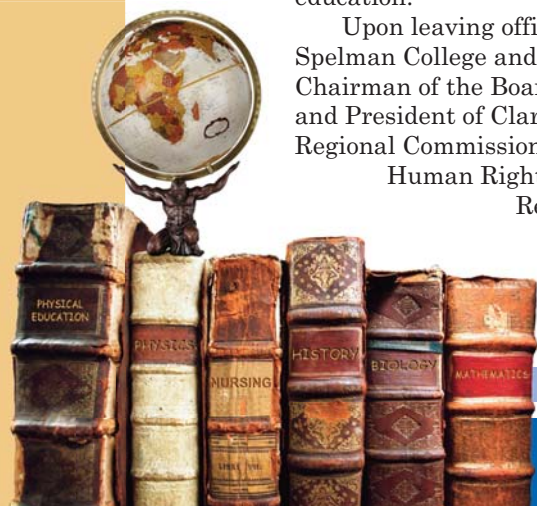
During her eight years, the city experienced unprecedented growth and afforded Mayor Franklin the opportunity to partner and collaborate with many local and regional leaders in addressing urban policy challenges which included urban planning, economic development and infrastructure.

She is best known for advocating for and tackling major government operations and ethics reform, launching the Atlanta Beltline, planning and executing over \$5 billion in airport and water infrastructure improvement, leading the acquisition of the Morehouse College Collection of Martin Luther King Jr. Papers, launching the Regional Commission on Homelessness and developing successful business and public sector partnerships and alliances. Aside from her role as a public official, her community service spans over 39 years in Atlanta and includes her active participation in the arts, homelessness and higher education.

Upon leaving office, she was appointed to the William and Camille Cosby Endowed Chair at Spelman College and served in this capacity until June 2011. She currently serves as the Chairman of the Board of Directors and Chief Executive Officer of Purpose Built Communities and President of Clarke-Franklin and Associates, Inc. She co-chairs the United Way of Atlanta's Regional Commission on Homelessness, serves as the Chair of the National Center of Civil and

Human Rights and serves on the board of the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR). Additionally, Mrs. Franklin serves on the board of Directors of Mueller Water Products and Delta Air Lines.

Mrs. Franklin is a frequent speaker on leadership, community engagement and public policy, having served over three decades as an executive in business and government.
