# Vision Statement

Albany State University will be a world-class comprehensive university and a powerful catalyst for the economic growth and development of Southwest Georgia. ASU will be recognized for its innovative and creative delivery of excellent educational programs, broad-based community engagement and public service, and creative scholarship and applied research, all of which enrich the lives of the diverse constituencies served by the University.

## The History

Founded in 1903, Albany State University continues to provide leadership in academic excellence, social change, and economic impact. A nationally top-ranked HBCU, ASU serves an increasingly diverse student body and community by offering a uniquely comprehensive array of programs, from associate to graduate degrees.

Joseph Winthrop Holley, the institution's founder and first president, established the Albany Bible and Manual Training Institute in Albany, Georgia. The new school was successful in its mission to provide religious and basic education, as well as teacher training to the local black population. In 1917, the state of Georgia began providing financial support to the school, granting it two-year status. The school added training in agriculture and was renamed the Georgia Normal and Agricultural College.

The institution eventually joined the University System of Georgia and, in 1943, was granted four-year status. Concentrating on teacher education and home economics, the school was again renamed, this time as Albany State College. Over the next few years, the College added majors in the humanities, social sciences, education, and health sciences.

After increasing the number of faculty with doctorate degrees by more than fifty percent, Albany State College began offering graduate degrees in 1981. With the growing success of the graduate programs, the Board of Regents, in 1996, approved the renaming of the institution to Albany State University. In the 21st century, the University continued to strengthen its mission, attracting nationally renowned scholars and researchers to its faculty and preparing students for leadership.

As ASU continued to grow, so did a newly established junior college in the Albany area. Founded in 1963, Albany Junior College provided students in Southwest Georgia and beyond access to higher education. When doors officially opened in 1966, 620 students enrolled in the institution. In 1987, the USG removed the word junior from all of its two-year institutions and the College became Darton College.

As part of its mission to serve its students and the region, Darton College committed to expanding its programs in nursing and the health sciences, expanding to 13 programs. As a result of this and other initiatives, such as the expansion of online programs, enrollment more than doubled after the year 2000. In this period, the campus facilities also grew, including the addition of a 427-seat theater and a massive physical education complex, among other improvements. In 2012, upon USG approval of the College's first four-year program, in nursing, the institution's name was changed to Darton State College.

On November 10, 2015, the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia voted unanimously to begin the process of consolidating Albany State University and Darton State College. That same day, Dr. Arthur N. Dunning became ASU's permanent president.

The newly established university retains the name Albany State University and unifies the distinction, values, and missions of the two institutions. One of Georgia's diverse, educational gems, Albany State University continues a combined legacy of more than 100 years of excellence in teaching and learning. The University prepares students to be effective contributors to a globally diverse society, where knowledge and technology create opportunities for personal and professional success.

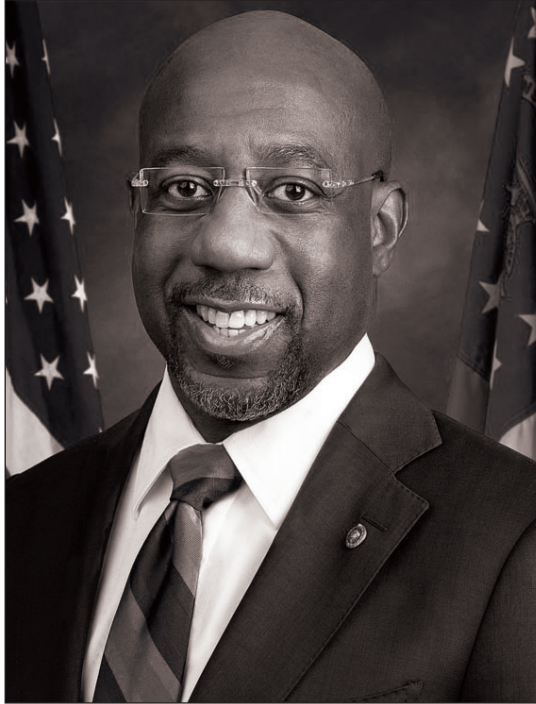

## Reverend Raphael G. Warnock

United States Senator

U.S. Senator Reverend Raphael G. Warnock was raised in public housing in Savannah, Georgia and is the eleventh of twelve children born to pastors Jonathan and Verlene Warnock, who instilled a sense of service in Warnock at a very young age.

A product of good public policy, Warnock is a Head Start and Upward Bound alum, and was inspired by Dr. King's teachings to matriculate to Atlanta's historic Morehouse College—using Pell Grants and low-interest student loans to become the first in his family to graduate from college. Following his graduation from Morehouse, he went on to receive his doctorate at the renowned Union Theological Seminary.

Since 2005, Warnock has served as Senior Pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, the former pulpit of Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He is the youngest pastor selected to serve

in that leadership role at the historic church. Additionally, Senator Warnock has long believed his ministry of service doesn't stop at the church doors, and as a pastor and longtime social justice advocate has worked to expand health care access, safeguard nutrition benefits, protect democracy and end mass incarceration.

Elected Georgia's first Black Senator in 2021, Senator Reverend Warnock has carried his service and advocacy into the Senate, where he has helped successfully pass legislation to create jobs, address the maternal mortality crisis and cap insulin costs for seniors at \$35 a month. Senator Warnock also was a lead negotiator of the only voting rights legislation to secure the support of the full Senate Democratic caucus.

The father of two young children and an ardent champion for education, Senator Reverend Warnock has actively worked in the Senate to bolster K-12 and higher education in Georgia and across the country. The Senator introduced legislation, the HEADWAY Act, to expand access to early learning, and helped pass the American Rescue Plan which made significant investments in the nation's K-12 schools.

On the higher education front, Senator Reverend Warnock has successfully secured hundreds of millions of dollars in federal funding for Georgia's HBCUs, and more than \$7 billion in total for HBCU campuses across the country. The Senator has also championed meaningful student debt cancellation and successfully pushed the Biden Administration to provide \$138 billion and counting in student debt cancellation for roughly 4 million Americans to date.

Additionally, Senator Reverend Warnock has pushed to strengthen state support for 1890's land-grant colleges and universities, to ensure get they get their fair share of funding, through the *Land-Grant Research Equity and Accountability Act*, and has passed legislation to honor first-generation college students.



# The Academic Degree

The first known degree was a doctorate conferred by the University of Bologna in the middle of the 12th Century. Originally, the title of master and doctor were used interchangeably, each indicating that the holder was licensed to give instruction to the students. The bachelor's or baccalaureate degree indicated only entrance upon a course of study preparatory to the Doctorate or Mastership. Gradually, however, the bachelor's degree came to mean successful completion of one level of study preparatory to higher degrees.

The use of academic degrees spread to English universities. Harvard University, William and Mary, and Yale followed the British pattern in the New World. There are more than 1,600 different academic degrees currently conferred by American colleges and universities.

The advanced degrees granted by Albany State University are the Education Specialist, the Master of Business Administration, the Master of Science in Criminal Justice, the Master of Education, Master of Social Work, the Master of Science in Nursing and the Master of Public Administration, which symbolize competence in research and scholarship or in the application of the results of research to practical problems.

## The Associate Degree

The associate degree represents completion of a two-year course of study of collegiate grade. The degree was first awarded in the U.K. in 1873, before spreading to the U.S. in 1898. Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science degree are usually earned in the Liberal Arts and Sciences such as humanities and social science fields; A.S. degrees are awarded to those studying in applied scientific and technical fields and professional fields of study.

## The Bachelor's Degree\*

The bachelor's degree represents completion of a four-year course of study of collegiate grade and is the oldest academic degree used by American institutions of higher learning. The degree, Bachelor of Arts, was first conferred in America in 1642 on nine young men comprising the first graduating class of Harvard (College) University. Albany State (College) University conferred its first Bachelor of Arts degree in 1947.

*\*Sometimes designated as the baccalaureate degree, from the Latin Baccalaureus from baccalarius "under the influence of" and laurus "laurel" used as designation of honor, distinction or fame.*

## The Master's Degree

The master's degree represents the successful completion of one or two years of study beyond the baccalaureate degree. This academic honor, which dates back to the establishment of the oldest universities in Europe, usually requires a thesis and an oral examination.

## The Specialist Degree

The increasingly popular Education Specialist Degree (Ed.S.) was first offered at the University of Kansas in 1950, and is awarded after completion of at least a year of graduate work beyond the master's level. This post-master's degree honor is often described as a sixth-year graduate degree that is pursued by practitioners in the field of Education.

## Academic Honors

Candidates for degrees who maintain high scholarship throughout four years in college are graduated with honors. Graduation is based on the grade point average (GPA) for all work prior to the awarding of the degrees. Seniors graduating with honors wear cords during Commencement. The averages necessary for earning graduation honors for all bachelor's degrees are as follows:

# Academic Regalia

---

Academic gowns and hoods worn for today's Commencement celebration and other formal academic ceremonies originated during the Middle Ages to keep monks and their students warm in drafty castles and halls. Over time, they became a symbol of academic pursuit, setting the academic community apart. The mortarboard evolved from skull caps worn by churchmen officiating at church ceremonies.

In 1984, the gown became standardized when the American Intercollegiate Commission determined that all academic robes would be black. The master's degree gown has long, closed sleeves while the doctoral degree gown has a facing of velvet extending from the hem to the neck and back with three velvet bands around each sleeve above the elbow. Hoods, which are the most distinctive feature of academic attire, are lined with silk in the colors of the institution granting the academic degree and trimmed in velvet in a color representing the field of study. ## The Mace

---

Dating back to medieval times when it was used as a weapon, the mace is now a recognized symbol of authority. Traditionally, colleges and universities use the mace to depict each institution's mission. The mace is carried in all formal academic processions that include the president of the university.

The mace for Albany State University is made of mahogany and was carved by African artists in Tanzania. This particular mace reveals a hand outstretched to God in reverence and supplication. The opening at its top symbolically articulates the concept that man, working through God, can not only improve but also flourish.
