

1999 Researcher of the Year

Dr. Ganiyu Titi Oladunjoye

Dr. Ganiyu Titi Oladunjoye, Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Business Information Systems and Education, has been named Albany State University Researcher of the Year for 1999. A prolific researcher and writer, Dr. Oladunjoye has produced a number of books and articles over his career in higher education.

Dr. Oladunjoye's recent research has been focused on telecommunications and business education. While he was a senior lecturer at the Ahmadu Bello University in Zaria, Nigeria, Dr. Oladunjoye published a series of WABP Junior Secondary Business Studies that were reprinted several times in the late 1980's and early 1990's. More recently his research on telecommunication and business education has been published in a variety of refereed journals. His articles include, "Technical Prowess of Business Educators: Initiatives and Motivation," "Assimilating Business Education into a Tech-Prep Model: Future Implications," "Preparing for Employment in the Next Millennium: Analyzing Perceptions of the Temporary Staffing Industry as to the Flexibility of Graduates of Business Education," "Professional Connections to Telecommunications Technology and Information Services: Is Business Education On-Line or On The Fringe?" and "Telecommunication Impacts: Comparison of Visions of the Leadership of Business Education and Personnel Directors in Business."

A graduate of Western Michigan University, where he received the B.B.A. and the M.A. with honors in Business Education, Dr. Oladunjoye received his Ph.D. degree in Education Administration and Business Education from Bowling Green State University in 1981. Dr. Oladunjoye is a member of several professional organizations.
