# About the Speaker

## Dr. Lee Formwalt

The keynote speaker for this year's Honors Day Convocation is Dr. Lee Formwalt, a familiar face at Albany State University and in the Southwest Georgia area. His commitment to preserving history and educating future generations is exemplified by his life's work.

Dr. Formwalt came to Albany State in September 1977 as an assistant professor of history, where he taught courses in world, Russian and American history and conducted research on Dougherty County and organized materials for Albany State's archives. During his time at Albany State, Dr. Formwalt rose through the ranks of associate professor and then full professor of history. He founded and served as editor of *The Journal of Southwest Georgia History*. Dr. Formwalt organized Thronateeska Heritage Foundation archives and collaborated with the Foundation to organize the photographic exhibit "The African American in Dougherty County at the Turn of the Century." He also coordinated the regional Georgia Quiz Bowl and supervised student teachers of high school American history. From September 1997 to September 1999, Dr. Formwalt served as the dean of the Graduate School at Albany State.

He left behind Southwest Georgia for the Midwest in October 1999 when he joined Indiana University as a scholar and executive director of the Organization of American Historians. In his role with the OAH, Dr. Formwalt supervised a staff of 20 and collaborated with numerous national historical and humanities organizations. His successes include increasing membership by 20 percent, increasing the annual budget by 67 percent, raising more than \$1 million with the new development program and beginning electronic publication of the OAH's journal, magazine and newsletter.

In December 2009, Dr. Lee Formwalt was named the executive director of the Albany Civil Rights Institute, which is devoted to the study and presentation of the Civil Rights Movement in Albany and Southwest Georgia.

Dr. Formwalt graduated *cum laude* with a bachelor's degree in history from the Catholic University of America in 1971. He earned a master's degree in history from the University of Massachusetts in 1972. In 1977, Formwalt earned a doctorate in history from the Catholic University of America.
